Attendance: We have a strong tradition of good attendance in St. Kilian's N.S. with an average attendance rate of 93.5% annually. However, this fell to an 89% attendance rate for the last school year. We have noted a marked deterioration in attendance and punctuality post Covid. 6454 days were lost during the school year 22/23 and 113 pupils missed in excess of 20 days.

We are anxious that parents be aware of the absolute necessity for regular punctual attendance at school and that we all work together to improve this area. Parents of pupils with poor attendance during the month of September will be invited to the school to discuss the matter. We will also be tracking those pupils who continually leave early especially on a Friday!



We are also encouraging pupils to come to school on time. <u>We can all be late</u> occasionally however pupils who are consistently late are disrupting the smooth running of the school. Our school opens to receive pupils at 8.40. All pupils should be through the front gate by 8.50am. There will be a punctuality check on Tuesday 10th October. Latecomers will be issued with cards.

Maths Week 2023: We will celebrate Maths Week in St. Kilian's from Monday 16th October. Maths Week has been great fun in our school over the past few years and we are all looking forward to learning lots during the week. There is a new Primary Maths Curriculum being rolled out presently. More information on this will be available through the newsletter over the coming months.

Parents and visitors may visit the fair on Tuesday 10th and Wednesday 10th October before school from 8:30am until 8:50am and immediately after school until 3:00pm. 


Maith Sibh David agus Liam! I know I have to work hard to improve.






<u>Learning Together</u>




5th Class - Corr na gCoille

5th class have been learning about the history of Alcatraz Prison in San Francisco. It was interesting to read and learn about all the different escape attempts, especially the infamous 'Escape From Alcatraz'. Nobody knows what happened to prisoners Frank Lee Morris, John Anglin or Clarence Anglin after they left Alcatraz Island on June 11th, 1962. There have been no traces of the men since. In English, pupils imagined they were one of the escapees and wrote detailed reports of their escape efforts. In art, the children created realistic 'Wanted Posters' of the three escapees.



In maths, we have been examining the topic of Data. We learned how to record information using tally sheets, pictograms, bar-line graphs and bar charts. In small groups, the children conducted surveys based on pupils' likes and interests. We surveyed pupils in our own class and in some of the other senior classes. We discovered that the dog is the most popular pet, action is the favourite movie genre and soccer is the most liked sport.



Mr. Maher's 4th class pupils visited us this week to conduct their own surveys using the school chromebooks.



There has been great excitement in 5th class with the Rugby World Cup currently taking place. We held a World Cup Sweepstake in which rugby nations were randomly allocated to pupils. Each child researched information about that country and wrote a fact file on it. We held a Country Debate in which pupils shared interesting facts about their countries and reasons for visiting them. Chile was the eventual winner.



In P.E., we have been learning how to play tag rugby for the first time. There are lots of rules involved in this game and it was quite difficult to grasp the concept of passing the ball backwards while trying to move forward. Jon Watt, from Virginia Rugby Club, visited the school in September to coach the 5th and 6th class pupils. Everyone had great fun getting involved in the sport and we look forward to Jon returning in a few weeks. Jon is originally from New Zealand so we hope to have the bragging rights next time we see him. Come on Ireland!
