# It has been very busy in Senior Infants recently! STOP, LOOK, LISTEN

We have learned how to cross the road safely. We spent some time in our classroom talking about what can be dangerous about crossing the road. We then learned the Safe Cross Code which is STOP, LOOK, LISTEN. We then learned to look left, look right and look left again. We also learned we should always cross at a pedestrian crossing if possible. We thought we should practice what we had learned so we went to the pedestrian crossing outside our school and practiced how to cross safely.


