Closures: Our upcoming closures are as follows:

Monday 5th February Lá Fhéile Bríde, a public holiday. Thursday 15th + Friday 16th February, Mid-term break. Friday 8th March, Referendum Monday 18th March, a Public Holiday, Lá Fhéile Pádraig.

The School Meals Programme aims to provide regular nutritious food to children to help improve their daily diet, to encourage school attendance and extra educational achievement by the children. Our school is now part of this programme and we will appoint a provider next week to supply hot meals to all our pupils from Monday 8th April. Children and parents make food choices on the food provider's app. The app will provide you with a flexible 3week rotating menu. The menu will ensure a balanced diet, incorporating a variety of tastes and nutritional elements. A wide variety of dietary needs, including Gluten Free, Dairy Free and Vegetarian options will be catered for. Meals will be delivered to the school, heated and distributed to the pupils in their classrooms. Children will receive meals in a compostable container and will have a hard lunchbox. Any unwanted food goes home in the container within the lunch box and the hard lunchbox returns to school daily. This will enable parents to monitor what their children are eating.

"My name is Emerson and my favourite toy is my projector pokemon watch. We have to turn the lights off and then it projects pokemon onto the ground"






The Very Young Scientist Exhibition.

Forces in Motion! This month, Ms King's Junior Infants have been busy exploring the theme of forces and motion in SESE. We had to predict the distance various toy vehicles would travel when descending ramps of various gradients. First, we used the balancing scales to see which vehicle was heavier.....



In our groups, we worked together to build our ramps using bricks and cardboard. We released our cars down the ramps using a gentle force and we determined that the heavier vehicle travelled further than the lighter vehicle!



We then decided to test whether an increase in the gradient of the ramp would affect the distance that the vehicles travel. Once we made our predictions it was time to test our theories. We were very excited to learn that the cars travelled much further and much faster by adding bricks to increase the gradient of the ramp.
